Paragraph 9: give general comments that summarise your opinion of the film, you may want to say something inspiring to get the reader to want to go out and see the film. Or you might want to say something that would make them not want to see it. 2. After this paragraph give it a star rating out of 5 to indicate how much you liked it!
